

## Seminars in the History of Collecting 2023

**Description:** Established in 2006, our Seminars in the History of Collecting series helps fulfil our commitment to the research and study of the history of collections and collecting, especially in the 18th and 19th centuries in Paris and London.

Seminars are normally held on the last Monday of every month, excluding August and December. They act as a forum for the presentation and discussion of new research into the history of collecting, and are open to curators, academics, historians, archivists and all those with an interest in the subject. Each seminar is 45-60 minutes long, with time for Q&A.

A detailed summary of each forthcoming seminar will be provided around the same time. The 2023 Seminars in the History of Collecting will be on Zoom and livestreamed via YouTube for the months of January to April.
